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## Trio of Treat Boxes - Instruction Sheet

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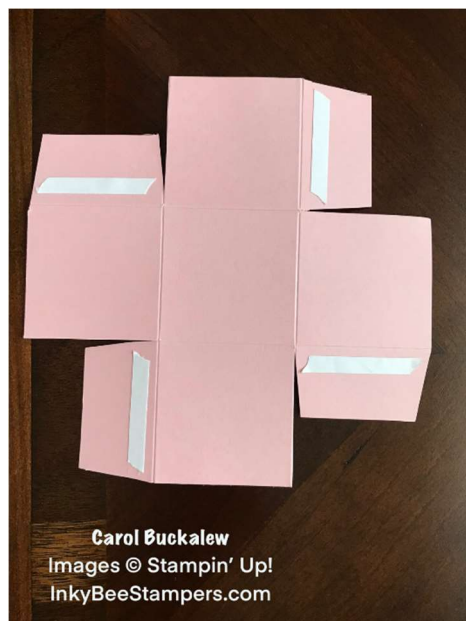
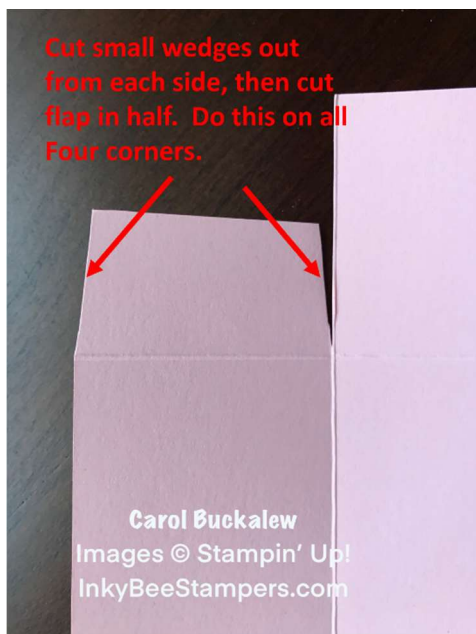
### Card Cuts:

- Large Box Base – 8" x 8" Blushing Bride Cardstock

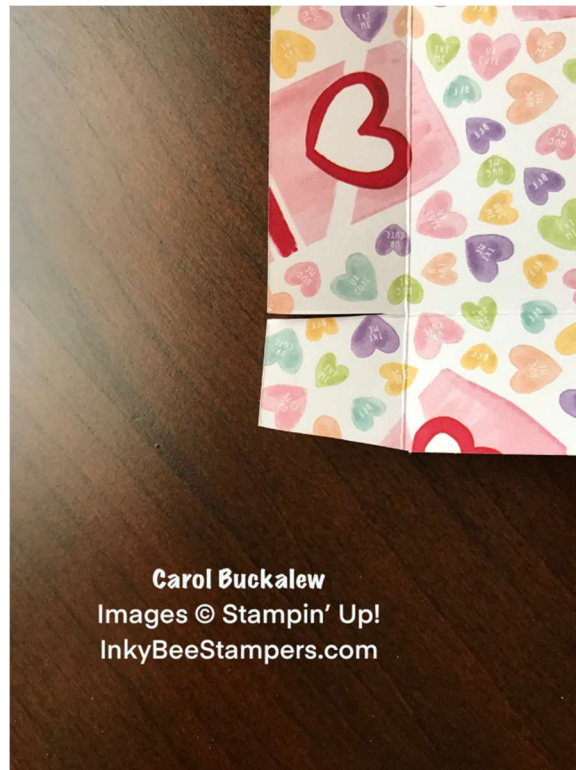
- Medium Box Base – 7" x 7" Blushing Bride Cardstock
- Small Box Base – 6" x 6" Blushing Bride Cardstock  
**Score all box bases at 2" on each side.**
- Large Box Lid – 6" x 6" piece of Sweet Talk DSP
- Medium Box Lid – 5" x 5" piece of Sweet Talk DSP
- Small Box Lid – 4" x 4" piece of Sweet Talk DSP  
**Score all box lids at 15/16 of an inch (just shy of 1") This will allow the lids to fit snugly onto the bases. The lids are cut from Designer Series Paper. When scoring, use a light hand, otherwise you risk scoring through the paper or damaging the paper.**
- You will need some small scraps of cardstock to cut several hearts and a banner for the sentiment.

## Assembling the Boxes:

- I used Blushing Bride Cardstock to cut all of the box bases.
- Three different designs of the Sweet Talk 12" x 12" Designer Series Paper were used for the box lids.
- Once all pieces of cardstock and DSP are cut and scored, use a bone folder to burnish all score lines.
- For all box bases, using a small pair of paper snips, cut at one corner to the score line, then cut small wedges on each side of this corner flap, then cut the flap in half. This will remove some of the paper bulk when you go to assemble your box bases.



- Once all of the corners for the box bases have been wedged and cut in half, use tear and tape on each corner. You can then assemble each box base, being sure to line up the corners (square).
- Repeat the same steps for each of the box lids. You will still cut a wedge on each side of the corner flaps, however you do not need to cut the corner flaps in half like you did for the box bases.



- Assemble each of the box lids.
- Now that the boxes and lids are assembled, you can now tie the stack of boxes together with ribbon. I used the white faux linen ribbon from the Flowers for Every Season Ribbon Combo Pack.
- Using the Sweet Hearts Dies, cut a few hearts and adhere these to sides of the box (see photo below). I cut a sentiment banner and using the Sweet Talk Stamp Set stamped a greeting and also adhered this to the front of the stack using Stampin' Dimensionals.



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Have fun and get creative with these fun and easy treat boxes!
