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## Daffodil Mother's Day Card Project Sheet

Daffodils mean spring is here! But they also make a lovely statement on this Mother's Day card. Take a look!



## Cutting:

- Card Base – Cut 1 in Mossy Meadow cardstock to 8-1/2" x 5-1/2", score at 4-1/4"
- Panel for Die Cut – Cut 1 in Basic White to approximately 4-1/4" x 3-1/4"
- Sentiment Label – Scrap of Basic White cardstock
- DSP – Cut 1 4-1/4" x 2"
- Inside Mat – Cut 1 Basic White cardstock to 5-1/4" x 4"
- Envelope Flap – Cut 1 coordinating DSP to approximately 2-3/4" x 6"

## Stamping, Die Cutting, and Coloring:

- Start off by die cutting the white panel for the front of the card. From the 4-1/4" x 3-1/4" piece of white cardstock, die cut using the largest rectangle die from the Stitched So Sweetly die set.
- Using VersaMark ink, stamp the multi-daffodil image from the Daffodil Daydream stamp set onto the die cut panel
- Using VersaMark ink, stamp the dotted image from the Daffodil Daydream stamp set across the lower left corner of the same panel.
- Sprinkle Gold Stampin' Emboss Powder over the panel and heat set.
- Stamp the "Happy Mother's Day" greeting onto a scrap of Basic White cardstock.
- Using the second to smallest sentiment die from the Stitched So Sweetly die set, die cut the sentiment label.
- For the white inside card mat, stamp the scroll across the bottom of the mat.
- Using a Blender Pen, color in the image of the daffodils and stems. I used Daffodil Delight and Pumpkin Pie to color the daffodil blooms and Mossy Meadow to color in the stems.



## Finishing the Card:

- Adhere the DSP to the lower 1/3 of the front of the card base – approximately 1” from the bottom of the card base.
- Apply Stampin’ Dimensionals to the back of the daffodil panel and adhere to the front of the card base – overlapping the DSP. Center the panel left to right and drop the bottom of the panel slightly below the bottom edge of the DSP.
- Apply Stampin’ Dimensionals to the back of the sentiment label but only where they will not overlap with the daffodil panel. Adhere to top left corner of card base, slightly overlapping the daffodil panel.
- Using a Mini Glue Dot, apply one Bumblebee Trinket to the bottom of the sentiment label.
- Using Linen Thread, tie a double bow and adhere to the stems of the daffodils using a Mini Glue Dot.
- Using Multipurpose glue, adhere the white mat to the inside of the card.
- Glue the piece of coordinating DSP to the envelope flap and fussy cut around the flap.

The card is complete!
