Flower Seed Gift Pouch Project Sheet

Here is another Friday Fun Day project...a flower seed gift pouch with a pull-out tag. I made several of these at one time to keep on hand to gift to someone special. This pouch could also be used for a gift card.



Flower Seed Pouch Instructions:

NOTE: You can make this pouch using only Designer Series Paper if you'd like. I made mine with cardstock as the base and added DSP.

Cutting

- Pouch Cut 1 Coral Calypso to 4-7/8" x 7-3/4". On the long side, score at 7-1/8" and 3-1/2"
- Pull-out Gift Tag Cut 1 Coral Calypso to 4-7/8" x 2"
- DSP to Decorate Outside of Pouch Cut 2 coordinating designer series paper to 4-3/4" x 3-3/8"

Stamping & Die Cutting

- From the Flowering Rain Boots stamp set, stamp the following
 - o 1 Watering Can in Soft Succulent
 - o 1 Flowerpot in Pumpkin Pie
 - o 2 Daisy Bouquets in Bumble Bee
- Die Cut All of the above using the Stampin' Cut & Emboss Machine
- Using the Fancy Tag Topper punch, punch one end of the pull-out gift tag, then stamp the sentiment onto the upper portion of the gift tag.

Pouch Half Circle Cut-out

- Lay the DSP onto the right side of the 3-1/2" score line, making sure that there is an even margin between the cardstock and the DSP. **Do not glue down the DSP yet!** You just want to make sure there is an equal margin between the cardstock and the DSP. Use Post-It tape or Washi tape to temporarily hold the DSP in place.
- From the 3-1/2" score line measure 1-3/4" and make a pencil mark on the cardstock.
- Line up the circle die and draw a half circle on the inside of the die onto the DSP.
- Repeat these steps for the other side of the 3-1/2" score line.
- Remove the temporarily adhered DSP from the cardstock, fold the cardstock in half and line up
 the circle die on the center mark you made. Secure the die with Post-It tape or Washi tape.
 Die cut. You will need to make more than one pass through the die cutting machine.
- Stack the DSP pieces together and line up the circle die with the half circle you marked on the DSP and die cut.



Assembling the Pouch:

• Using Tear & Tape, place tape along the side edge (where you scored at 7-1/8") then place Tear & Tape along the bottom long edge of the cardstock (opposite side from the ½ circle die cuts). Remove tape covers. Fold cardstock in half at the 3-1/2" score line being sure to line up bottom edges, then fold side flap over and press firmly to secure. Refer to photo below.



- Using Multipurpose glue, adhere a piece of the DSP on each side of the pouch, making sure there is an equal margin between the cardstock and the DSP.
- Glue the watering can to the front of the pouch, then adhere the flowers to the top of the watering can, slightly overlapping the flowers onto the watering can.
- For the pull-out tag, glue the flowerpot towards the bottom of the tag. Glue the flowers to the top of the flowerpot, slightly overlapping the flowers onto the flowerpot.
- Cut a piece of ribbon and loop through the slot at the top of the tag by folding the ribbon in half and threading both ends through the slot, then pull the ends through the loop of the ribbon and pull gently to secure.

Your flower seed pouch or gift card holder is ready to gift to that special someone! I hope you give this project a try!
