Project Sheet - Mar 8 2023



This card is a CASE (Create and Share Everything) from the May 2022-April 2023 Annual Catalog using the *Cottage Rose Stamp Set* and the *Cottage Flowers Dies*! I added a little of the *Vellum Basics 12" x 12" Specialty Designer Series Paper* from the current Mini Catalog just to change things up a bit. The whitewash technique is incredibly easy to do, and this card worked up in a jiff! Let's get started!

Supplies Needed:

- Cottage Rose Stamp Set
- Cottage Flowers Dies
- Vellum Basics 12" x 12 " Specialty Designer Series Paper
- Blender Pen
- Whisper White Craft Stampin' Ink Refill (white pigment ink)
- Basic Black cardstock
- Basic White cardstock
- Smoky Slate cardstock
- Tuxedo Black Memento Ink

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- Old Olive Stampin' Blends
- Basic Black Stampin' Write Marker
- Flirty Flamingo Stampin' Blends

1. Card Cuts:

- Card Base Cut 1 Basic Black cardstock to 8-1/2" X 5-1/2", score at 4-1/4"
- Panel Cut 1 Smoky Slate cardstock to 5-3/8" x 4-1/8"
- Vellum Strip Cut 1 Vellum Basics Specialty Designer Series Paper (any pattern) to 5-3/8" x 1-1/4"
- Die Cut Flowers Cut 1 Basic White cardstock to 2-1/4" x 2"
- Sentiment Label Cut 1 Basic White cardstock to 2" x 1"
- Inside Mat Cut 1 Smoky Slate cardstock to 5-3/8" x 4-1/8"
- Inside Panel Cut 1 Basic White cardstock to 5-1/4" x 4"
- 2. Use the large rose and leaf image and stamp this image using Tuxedo Black Memento Ink four times onto the Smoky Slate Panel. Stamp the image in each corner of the panel and turn the stamp so that the rose is not facing in the same direction each time you stamp it.
- 3. Color all of the leaves using the light shade of an Old Olive Stampin' Blend. Color all of the Baby's Breath (tiny flowers) using the light shade of a Flirty Flamingo Stampin' Blend.
- 4. Squeeze a few drops of the Whisper White Craft Stampin' Ink onto a small stamping block. Using a Blender Pen, brush the white ink onto all areas of the flower petals where there are no stamped lines. Try to avoid brushing any white ink onto the black stamped lines of the flowers. Tip: I dab the Blender Pen in the white ink and then roll the tip of the pen on its side to distribute the ink on the tip of the pen. The white pigment ink is thick, and you want to avoid dropping any blobs of ink onto the stamped image. Once the ink dries you may want to go back and reapply white ink on the tips of the flowers as the ink dries lighter.
- 5. Using a Basic Black Stampin' Write marker darken the centers of the flowers (stamens). I drew in the short lines of the stamens then added dots for the ends of the stamens.
- 6. Using the Cottage Flowers Dies set, die cut the double flower open image from white cardstock.
- 7. From the Cottage Rose Stamp Set, stamp the sentiment "Best Wishes" onto the sentiment label using Tuxedo Black Memento Ink.
- 8. To adhere the vellum strip to the card front, I centered the vellum on the Smoky Slate panel, then positioned the sentiment label over the vellum to determine placement. I used a pencil and made a light mark on the vellum strip above and to the right and left of the sentiment label. I turned the vellum strip over and applied glue to the area between the pencil marks and adhered the vellum strip to the panel. Once the vellum was adhered I used a pencil eraser to erase the pencil marks I had made. I then placed two very small drops of glue (just a pin drop) under the right and left edges of the vellum to adhere the sides of the vellum down.
- 9. Adhere the Smoky Slate panel to the card front.

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- 10. Adhere the sentiment label to the card front using Stampin' Dimensionals and center the label from right to left. The sentiment label hangs over the bottom of the vellum strip by about a 1/4". Adhere the die cut flowers to the card front, tucking the stem of the flowers under the center top of the sentiment label. You will need to trim the stem of the flowers.
- 11. On the Inside Panel, stamp the large rose and leaf image onto the lower left corner of the panel using Tuxedo Black Memento ink. Adhere the panel to its Smoky Slate mat, then adhere this unit to the inside of the card.



- 12. Stamp this same large flower image partially onto the lower left of the envelope front.
- 13. On the envelope flap, stamp the smaller flower image using Tuxedo Black Memento ink.

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The card is complete! Isn't it lovely? The whitewash technique is so much fun!
