

I have something different for you today. I created a floral wall hanging using the Paper Florist Dies! These little flowers were so much fun to create! I purchased a small 6" x 6" framed wood craft sign from my local craft store...it cost less than \$1.50. I used some craft acrylic paint to paint the wood sign then decorated it with flowers, leaves, a ribbon bow and a large gem. The possibilities are endless with the Paper Florist Dies! Use up your paper scraps in whatever colors you have available!

Non-Stampin' Up! Supplies Used:

- Wood sign Purchase from your local craft store. Any size or shape will work!
- Glue Gun
- · Acrylic Paint in White or Cream Your choice of color
- Craft Paintbrush

- Paper Florist Dies
- · Iridescent Pastel Gems


Project Sheet - May 31 2023

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- Sheer Ribbon Combo Pack
- Multipurpose Liquid Glue
- Bone Folder
- Stampin' Cut & Emboss Machine
- Paper: Mossy Meadow, Soft Sea Foam, Pecan Pie, Basic Black, Daffodil Delight, Fresh Freesia, Highland Heather, Berry Burst, Bubble Bath
- Stampin' Cut & Emboss Machine
- 1. Prepare the 6" x 6" Wood sign. I used fine sandpaper to smooth any rough spots on my sign (optional). Use white or cream craft acrylic paint and paint the sides, frame and interior of the sign. Allow to dry for an hour or so then apply a second coat of paint. Allow to dry thoroughly before gluing flowers to surface.
- 2. Die cut all of the leaves, and flower pieces as shown and follow the directions provided for assembly.
- Bubble Bath Flowers: Cardstock scraps used include Bubble Bath, Pecan Pie, Daffodil Delight and Basic Black. Use the dies shown below from the Paper Florists die set to cut out the number indicated per color. Use a bone folder to curl the Bubble Bath petals upwards. Adhere the Bubble Bath flowers to each other, making sure to offset the petals. Adhere the Pecan Pie circle to the center of the flower. Next, adhere the Daffodil Delight stamen on top of the Pecan Pie center. Lastly, adhere the Basic Black center. Note that you will have left over Pecan Pie pieces...save these for a future project.

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
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• Berry Burst Flower: Cardstock scraps used include Berry Burst, Daffodil Delight, and Basic Black. Use the dies shown below from the Paper Florists die set to cut out the number indicated per color. Use a bone folder to curl the Berry Burst petals upwards. There are a total of six individual petals in this flower. You will glue each petal to the back of the Daffodil Delight center. I worked in a clockwise direction, gluing one flower, turning, then gluing the next flower to the back of the Daffodil Delight center until all petals were adhered. Adhere the Basic Black stamen to the Daffodil Delight center. Gently curl up the ends of the black stamen ends with your fingers. Adhere a large white Iridescent Gem to the center of the flower.

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
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• Fresh Freesia Flower: Cardstock scraps used include Fresh Freesia, Highland Heather and Daffodil Delight. Use the dies shown below from the Paper Florists die set to cut out the number indicated per color. Note: For the Fresh Freesia flower, I only used the two large flowers and set aside the two small flowers for a future project. Use a bone folder to curl the Fresh Freesia petals upwards then adhere the flowers together, making sure to offset the petals. Adhere the Daffodil Delight Stamen to the center of the flower. For the Highland Heather die cut (long, thin die cut), start at one end and tightly roll the paper into a coil then secure the end with a little liquid glue. Once the glue has set use your finger to tease out the cut ends of the rolled flower then adhere to the center of the Fresh Freesia flower.

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
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• Leaves: Cardstock scraps used to die cut the leaves include Mossy Meadow and Soft Sea Foam. Use the dies shown below from the Paper Florists die set to cut out the number indicated per color. Use your bone folder to slightly curl the tips of the leaves. You can also gently fold the leaves along the dashed lines if desired.

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
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• Berry Burst Flower Buds: Cardstock scraps used include Berry Burst and Mossy Meadow. Use the dies shown below from the Paper Florists die set to cut out the number indicated per color. Adhere the Berry Burst Buds behind the Mossy Meadow stem so that the buds are peeking above the stem.

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- 3. Use a small amount of hot glue to adhere the flowers to the wood craft sign. I first glued the large Berry Burst flower onto the lower left corner of the sign. Glue the two Bubble Bath flowers just above the Berry Burst flower and to the left of the sign. Next, glue one Mossy Meadow leaf and one Soft Sea Foam leaf above the Bubble Bath flowers towards the left edge of the sign. Adhere the remaining to leaves to the right of the Berry Burst flower along the bottom of the sign. Adhere the Fresh Freesia flower to the right of the Berry Burst flower. Lastly, adhere the Berry Burst flower buds between the Bubble Bath flower and the Fresh Freesia flower.
- 4. Tie a bow using Bubble Bath from the Sheer Ribbon Combo Pack. Adhere the bow at the top center of the wood sign.

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This completes our paper flower arrangement! These flowers aren't just for arranging onto a frame. By keeping the flowers flatter they can be used to decorate your card fronts or scrapbooking pages! You can also mix and match the components to create simple flowers...or really spectacular flowers! And create your flowers in any colors that you choose. I can definitely see myself creating some fun Christmas decorations or Valentine's Day arrangements on maybe a wooden heart! Drop some pretty Designer Series Paper behind your flowers to step them up a notch! The sky is the limit!
