

I used the Easter Lilies Stamp Set, the Timber 3D Embossing Folder and some masking, blending and fussy cutting to create this pretty Easter card! Originally, I had created a card using both the Easter Lilies Stamp Set and Easter Lilies Dies, but then discovered that the dies are currently unavailable. The dies will be back in stock about mid-April...but after Easter has passed. So, I made this second card (Card #1) using just the stamp set. Scroll to the bottom of this tutorial to view the original card using the dies and stamp set (Card #2).

### Supplies:

- Easter Lilies Stamp Set
- Timber 3D Embossing Folder
- Rustic Metallic Adhesive-Backed Dots
- White Pigment Ink or white gel pen
- Basic Black Stampin' Write Marker
- Blending Brush
- Blender Pen
- Cardstock: Gorgeous Grape, Highland Heather, Basic White

### Project Sheet - Mar 22 2024

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- Ink: Gorgeous Grape, Highland Heather, Granny Apple Green
- Stampin' Blends: Fresh Freesia, Highland Heather

#### 1. Card Cuts:

- Card Base Cut 1 Gorgeous Grape cardstock to 8-1/2" x 5-1/2", score at 4-1/4"
- Outside & Inside Mats Cut 2 Highland Heather cardstock to 5-3/8" x 4-1/8":
- Outside & Inside Panels Cut 2 Basic White cardstock to 5-1/4" x 4"
- Scrap piece of Basic White cardstock for stamping, coloring and fussy cutting a lily

### Card #1

### 2. Prepare the front panel of the card:

- Use two pieces of 1/2" Post It Tape or Washi Tape to mask off a cross on one of the white panels measuring 5-1/4" x 4". Position the masked cross onto the upper right of the panel. Use a Blending Brush to blend Highland Heather ink from the top right of the panel towards the lower left of the panel and be sure to blend ink over the masked area.
- Carefully remove the mask, then stamp the sentiment "He is Risen" in Gorgeous Grape ink onto the lower left of the panel.
- Stamp the lily flower image onto the panel using Gorgeous Grape ink. Stamp the flower to the lower left of the cross. Use Highland Heather and Fresh Freesia Stampin' Blends to color in the flower image. Color the entire flower image in the dark shade of a Fresh Freesia Stampin' Blend. Then use the light and dark shades of Highland Heather Stampin' Blends to color the tips and bases of the petals leaving the centers of the petals lighter. Blend the darker Highland Heather areas using a Fresh Freesia Stampin' Blend. Use a Basic Black Stampin' Write Marker to trace over and darken the stamens of the flower center. Use a Blender Pen and Gorgeous Grape ink to add shadows behind the petals. This really makes the flower pop!
- Dot the flower petals with white pigment ink or a white gel pen to add interest to the flower petals.
- Emboss the panel using the Timber 3D Embossing Folder.
- Adhere the embossed panel to one of the Highland Heather mats, then adhere this to the card front using Stampin' Dimensionals.


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- 3. Stamp a second lily onto a scrap piece of Basic White cardstock. Color this second lily as you did in Step #2 above. Use a small pair of scissors or Paper Snips to fussy cut the flower. I did not leave a white border around this lily...I cut right up next to the stamped outline of the flower. Use a bone folder to curl up the outer edges of the petals then adhered this second flower to the embossed panel using Stampin' Dimensionals.
- 4. On the inside white panel, stamp the sentiment "Peace I give unto you" in Gorgeous Grape ink. Second generation stamp the palm leaf image over the sentiment using Granny Apple Green ink. Adhere the panel to the remaining Highland Heather mat, then adhere this to the inside of the card.

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- 5. On the envelope front first and second generation stamp the palm leaf image using Granny Apple Green ink. The images were only partially stamped onto the lower left corner of the envelope.
- 6. On the envelope flap, first generation stamp the palm leaf image using Granny Apple Green ink.
- 7. Add three Rustic Metallic Adhesive-Backed Dots to the card front to finish up the project.

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
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This completes card #1. I love how this card turned out and I hope you like it too! If you have the Easter Lily Dies and would like to make a second version of this card...read on!

### Card #2:

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Additional supplies used: Easter Lily Dies, Parakeet Party cardstock, Crushed Curry cardstock, Pumpkin Pie ink, Sponge Daubers.

- Prepare the front panel the same as you did for Card #1, except do not stamp the lily image onto the panel. Only mask off the cross, ink blend, then stamp the sentiment in the lower left corner of the panel and emboss the panel. Adhere the panel to a Highland Heather mat, then adhere this to the card front using liquid glue.
- Use the Easter Lily Dies to cut out the flower petals from Highland Heather cardstock. Die cut the flower stamen from Crushed Curry cardstock.


Use Sponge Daubers to darken the bases and tips of each flower petal in Gorgeous Grape ink. Leave the centers of the flower petals lighter.

Use Pumpkin Pie ink to darken the tips of the stamens.

Use a Bone Folder to curl the petals under.

Use liquid glue to assemble the flower. Assemble the two large petal sections together first. Then, adhere the stamen to the center of the flower, then adhere the two smaller petal sections towards the bottom of the flower.

Use white craft ink or a white gel pen to dot the petals.



- Using the Easter Lily Dies, die cut three leaves from Parakeet Party cardstock. Use a Sponge Dauber to darken the base and tips of the leaves using Granny Apple Green ink.
- Determine the placement of the leaves, then adhere the leaves to the embossed panel using liquid glue.
- Adhere the assembled, die cut lily to the card front (just to the lower left of the cross) using Stampin' Dimensionals.
- Complete the inside of the card and the envelope the same as you did for Card #1.
